Course Description

This course is designed for under graduate students who are non-native speakers of Spanish in order to further develop their communication skills in the target

language. Activities will include practicing basic vocabulary and grammar structures, writing short sentences, various speaking activities, reading and writing short passages, short oral presentations. The students will be taught about the language and the culture of Spanish speaking countries. Students will be expected to write in-classroom quizzes, present orally short passages, participate actively in the classroom activities and fulfil all given assignments. The overall grade from the course will be established on the basis of the progress the Ss make throughout the duration of the course.

Course Objectives

By the end of this course, learners should be able to:

- (a) Produce short sentences in the target language;
- (b) Differentiate between different Spanish accents;
- (c) Talk about different countries, and correctly use adjectives connected with them;
- (d) Make short presentations of different topics;

Course Policies

(1) Attendance and participation

Attendance is required. You are expected to actively participate in class activities.

(2) Written quizzes (optional)

At few separate times during the semester, you may be responsible for writing a quiz from the things that were covered in the classroom before. The instructor will provide individual feedback. The quizzes will be stored and will provide further feedback for students on their progress throughout the course.

(3) Oral exam

On two occasions, the students will need to pass an oral exam. The first one, during the mid-term, will be held from the pronunciation, while the second one will cover all the topics we did in class.

Full attendance means arriving **on time**, remaining present, actively participating in class discussions, and completing assignments and readings before the class meets.
